New and previous members MUST attend a Range Orientation Class (ROC).

ROCs will be scheduled on the 1st Saturday of the month (April through October) at the Trap Range Club House starting 10am sharp. Be sure to monitor your email for information and directions to the ROC. If you cannot make these dates, please call (661) 750-2225 or email the Club Secretary to make appointment, however this can significantly delay your ROC date.

Your Membership Card will be handed out at the end of the Range Orientation.

Membership is subject to agreement to adhere to the basic safety rules and to the Tehachapi Sportsman Club Range Rules on page 2. Membership renewals are processed between the December and January. The next year's renewal form will be available in early December on the TSC web site for download. The gate combination is changed annually in late February. Do not substitute previous year forms or new member forms for a renewal. **CURRENT TSC MEMBERS: DO NOT USE THIS FORM TO RENEW!**

2026 Tehachapi Sportsman Club Range Rules

1. Being under the influence of alcohol or mind-altering drugs is not allowed on range premises.
2. Everyone on the range must obey the posted basic safety rules and all club rules.
3. All adult guests must sign and file a liability waiver to be on TSC property. Members must sign and file a liability waiver for guests that are minors. The liability waiver is valid for one day, previous guests need to file another waiver. See the TSC website for liability waivers. All guests must be under the direct supervision of a member who must be present with the shooters at the immediate shooting station.
4. All firearms must be brought onto and off the range in an unloaded condition. Law enforcement officers and holders of a valid CCW permit are exempt from this rule.
5. Members are never permitted to give the range lock combination to anyone.
6. Members will clean up after using the range and will leave the range in as good or better condition than it was found.
7. When entering the range, be sure to raise the red flag and lock the gate. The speed limit on the range is 10 MPH.
8. When leaving the range, the last person to leave will lower the red flag and lock the gate.
9. The gate may only be left open when manned by a range master or club officer. If left open there will be a 100% check for valid membership at the gate. Check for a current membership card for anyone following you through the gate.
10. Bottles, cans, metallic or other non-standard targets are not allowed at any time.
11. Firing at rocks either on the ground or berms, or any object on the hillside is not allowed.
12. Do not attach targets over a vertical or horizontal supports. Use only the backboard material between the supports.
13. Do not place targets on the ground.
14. Stationary clay targets are permitted on the MPR ONLY and must be placed on the berms no higher than 4 feet from the top.
15. Live ammunition may not be disposed of in the trashcans.
16. Rifles chambered in .22LR are allowed on the pistol range. Shotguns are not allowed on the pistol or rifle ranges. Rifles and handguns are not allowed on the trap and skeet ranges. During rifle use on the MPR, the pistol steel must not be in line of fire.
17. All shooters will temporarily cease fire whenever anyone is down range or on the north side of our property, from our back fence to the top of the hill beyond. Consider the range closed if this area is occupied by anyone.
18. The only size of shot allowed on the Trap and Skeet ranges is #7 ½ or smaller. Armor piercing, incendiary ammunition, bullets containing any steel, and rounds that have more than 8000 ft-lbs of muzzle energy are not allowed to be fired on the range. Only arrows or bolts are allowed on the archery range. Center fire rifles, shotguns, and pistols chambered in center fire rifle rounds are not to be fired at the pistol steel on the multipurpose range.
19. Fully automatic firearms are permitted for law enforcement training only by prior approval by a vote of the membership at a regular monthly meeting. Trigger acceleration devices including but not limited to bump stocks, binary triggers, and forced reset triggers are not allowed.
20. No vandalism of any kind will be tolerated.
21. Any person found violating basic safety rules and/or club rules will be given a hearing by the board. This may result in fines, dismissal from the club, or loss of club privileges for a period of time deemed by the board to be appropriate to the violation.
22. All firearms will be pointed down range at all times.
23. Cross range shooting is not permitted.
24. Before using the pistol ranges or MPR, check for people at the 200 and 300 yard rifle ranges. Before using the MPR check for people at the 100 yard rifle range. Do not start shooting until these ranges are clear and people are back at the firing line.
25. A ten minute target marking period will be observed every half hour when multiple shooters occupy the range. The pistol ranges and multipurpose range must be checked and a cease fire called, before going down to the 200 and/or 300 yard targets. The multipurpose range must be checked and a cease fire called, before going down to the 100 yard rifle range targets. During a cease fire, all firing lines shall be closed and firearms must be unloaded, actions open, grounded or holstered, and no firearms will be handled. No lingering between the firing line and cease fire line during a cease fire. Upon returning to the firing line, inform all shooters that the range is open.
26. Be respectful of others. Criminal activity, being argumentative or disruptive, profanity, coarse or abusive language, and actions, will not be tolerated.
27. Members must use their own stands only at the multipurpose range, the stands must be made of wood or PVC and be at least 6 feet tall to ensure shots have the berm as a back stop. Only paper targets are allowed on the stands. Do not take stands from the pistol range to the MPR. When using the pistol steel on the MPR, the firing line can be no closer than 15 yards from the steel.

I hereby certify that I have read and understand the above rules. Furthermore, I agree to abide by and have all my guests abide by these rules at all times while at or using the club range. I certify that I am legally entitled to possess firearms in the State of California.
